When Yomtov nullifies (cuts short) the Shiva

- 1. The *Halocho* is that *Shiva* is observed for seven days. However, when *YomTov* occurs in the middle of *Shiva*, *Shiva* ends at the beginning of *YomTov*. Even if the funeral took place on *Erev Yomtov* in the afternoon and *Shiva* was observed for a few minutes, *Shiva* ends at the beginning of Yomtov
- 2. The Yomim Tovim that cut Shiva short are: Rosh Hashono, Yom Kippur, Sukkos, Pesach and Shovuos.

Below are the Halochois in regards to to *Pesach* that cuts short Shiva:

- 3. Selling *Chometz*: The *Ovel* (mourner) may sell his *Chometz* during *Shiva* from home. This is not considered "doing business".
- 4. **Bedikas Chometz:** The Ovel may perform Bedikas Chometz in his home. If he has other places that require Bedikas Chometz, he should send a Shliach to perform it.
- 5. Siyum of Erev Pesach: If the Siyum is performed in the Ovel's home, he may participate. However, if he wants to make a Siyum or participate in a Siyum outside of his home, he has to wait until after Chatzos (midday).
- 6. **Biur Chometz:** The Ovel should either make a fire outside his home, or he should discard the *Chometz* in the toilet (in small quantities as not to cause a clog), or he can put some bleach (or detergent) on it and put it in the garbage. Then he says the *Kol Chamira* and the *Yehi Rotzon*.
- 7. *Aveilus* is over at *Chatzos* (-midday, see the local calendar) and unlike in a regular *Shiva*, there is no need to tell the *Aveilim* to get up etc.
- 8. (At some point, the nail will be knocked in the floor, the *Aveilim* will go around the block and go into the store of a non-Jew to buy something and leave the change).
